## Ticino Spritz | 1 Serving

### INGREDIENTS

- 3 oz Prosecco
- 2 oz Aperol
- 1 oz soda water
- Ice
- Orange slice (for garnish)

### PREPARATION

1. Fill a large wine glass with ice.
2. Pour in the Prosecco, followed by the Aperol.
3. Add a splash of soda water.
4. Stir gently and garnish with an orange slice.



## Risotto al Limone | 4 Servings

### INGREDIENTS

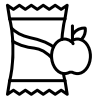
- 1 cup Arborio rice
- 4 cups chicken or vegetable broth
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Juice and zest of 1 lemon
- 2 tablespoons butter
- Salt and pepper to taste

### PREPARATION

1. Heat broth in a saucepan and keep warm.
2. In another pan, heat olive oil and sauté onion until soft.
3. Add rice and cook for 1–2 minutes.
4. Gradually add warm broth, 1/2 cup at a time, stirring frequently until absorbed.
5. Continue until rice is tender (about 18–20 minutes).
6. Stir in Parmesan, lemon juice, zest, and butter.
7. Season with salt and pepper and serve immediately.



## LUGANO, SWITZERLAND – SNACKS



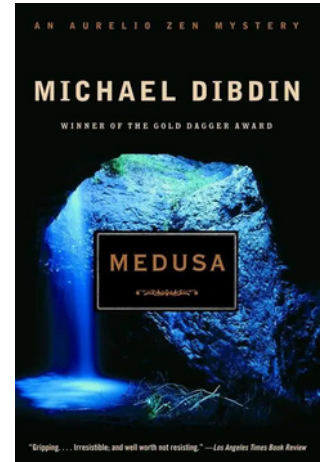
- **Loacker Quadratini Wafer Cookies:** Loacker Quadratini wafers are a classic Alpine treat made with crisp layers and smooth cream filling, often flavored with hazelnut or chocolate. Widely available in the United States, they offer a light, satisfying taste of the region.
- **Lindt Chocolate Bars:** Lindt chocolate is one of Switzerland’s most iconic sweets, known for its smooth texture and rich flavor. Easily found in U.S. stores, it provides a simple, indulgent taste of Swiss chocolate tradition.
- **Amaretti Cookies:** Amaretti cookies are traditional almond biscuits popular in the Ticino region. With a crisp exterior and soft center, they offer a delicate flavor and are widely available in U.S. grocery and specialty stores.

## LUGANO, SWITZERLAND – MOVIES

### MOVIE SELECTION

- **Bread and Tulips (2000):** This charming Italian film follows a woman who unexpectedly starts a new life after being left behind on a trip, eventually making her way through northern Italy and toward the Swiss border region. With its gentle humor and scenic storytelling, it captures the relaxed, cross-cultural atmosphere similar to Lugano. It is available to stream or rent in the United States.
- **Quantum of Solace (2008):** Part of the James Bond series, this film includes scenes set in Switzerland and showcases dramatic alpine landscapes similar to those surrounding Lugano. While more action-focused, it highlights the striking contrast between mountains, water, and modern European settings. It is widely available in the U.S.

### FUN FACTS

1. **Lugano is located in the Italian-speaking canton of Ticino, making it one of the few places in Switzerland where Italian is the primary language.** The city reflects a strong blend of Swiss organization and Italian culture, seen in its architecture, cuisine, and daily life.
2. **Lugano sits along the shores of Lake Lugano, a glacial lake that stretches across both Switzerland and Italy.** The lake is surrounded by mountains, creating a landscape that combines alpine scenery with a Mediterranean feel.
3. **Piazza della Riforma is the heart of Lugano’s historic center.** This lively square is lined with pastel-colored buildings and cafés and serves as a central gathering place for festivals, markets, and everyday life.
4. **Lugano has a milder climate than much of Switzerland, allowing palm trees and subtropical plants to grow along its waterfront.** This unique climate contributes to the city’s relaxed, almost Mediterranean atmosphere.
5. **Lugano is an important cultural and financial center in southern Switzerland.** In addition to its scenic beauty, the city is known for hosting international events, art exhibitions, and music festivals throughout the year.

- Why do you think border regions like Lugano often develop such unique identities?
- What role do you think language plays in shaping a community’s culture and traditions?

## Architecture & Environment

- What did you notice about the buildings and piazzas in Lugano? How did they compare to places you’ve seen before?
- Lugano is surrounded by both mountains and water. How do you think that landscape influences daily life there?
- Did the pastel-colored buildings and open squares create a certain feeling or mood for you?
- If you could sit anywhere we saw on the tour, a square, a lakeside bench, or a quiet street, where would you choose and why?

## LUGANO, SWITZERLAND – ACCESSIBILITY



### Ease of Movement Throughout the City

- Lugano is widely regarded as an easy city to navigate, with a compact center that is largely walkable and designed for comfort and safety.
- The historic center, including main squares and lakefront promenades, is generally flat and pedestrian-friendly, making it manageable for those with reduced mobility.
- The city integrates transportation seamlessly with daily life, allowing visitors to move between areas without long distances or complicated routes.

### Public Transportation Accessibility

- Lake Lugano itself is accessible through boat services that connect towns and attractions, offering a comfortable way to experience the region without physical strain.

## LUGANO, SWITZERLAND – 24 HOURS IN LUGANO, SWITZERLAND



- **8:00 AM – 9:00 AM | Lakeside Breakfast and Morning Views**
  - Begin the day along the lakefront promenade as Lugano slowly comes to life. Enjoy a relaxed breakfast with coffee and a light pastry while taking in views of Lake Lugano and the surrounding mountains. Morning is a peaceful time to observe local routines as residents walk, cycle, and gather by the water.
- **9:00 AM – 11:00 AM | Walking Through the Historic Center**
  - Make your way into the heart of Lugano’s old town, where narrow streets open into elegant piazzas. Stroll through Piazza della Riforma, the city’s main square, and explore the surrounding streets lined with pastel-colored buildings, boutiques, and cafés. As you walk, notice the blend of Swiss order and Italian charm reflected in the architecture and atmosphere.
- **11:00 AM – 12:30 PM | Cultural Landmarks and Local Stories**
  - Continue your walk toward some of Lugano’s historic churches and cultural landmarks. Step inside to admire simple yet beautiful interiors and learn about the region’s religious and cultural traditions. Along the way, pause in quiet corners of the city where daily life unfolds, offering a deeper sense of place beyond the main squares.
- **12:30 PM – 2:00 PM | Lunch with a Regional Influence**
  - Settle in for a leisurely lunch at a local restaurant. This is a perfect opportunity to enjoy dishes that reflect Lugano’s Swiss-Italian identity, such as risotto or polenta. Meals here are meant to be savored, so take your time and enjoy both the food and the relaxed pace of the city.
- **2:00 PM – 4:00 PM | Scenic Views from Above**
  - Head toward one of Lugano’s nearby viewpoints, easily reached by funicular or short transport ride. From above, take in sweeping views of the lake, the city’s red-tiled rooftops, and the surrounding mountains. This perspective offers a deeper appreciation for Lugano’s unique setting between alpine and Mediterranean landscapes.
- **4:00 PM – 5:30 PM | Lakeside Walk and Leisure Time**
  - Return to the waterfront for a gentle walk along the promenade. This is one of the most enjoyable times of day to explore at a relaxed pace, with plenty of places to sit, rest, and take in the scenery. The combination of water, greenery, and open space creates a calm and inviting environment.
- **5:30 PM – 7:00 PM | Aperitivo and Early Evening Atmosphere**

Afterward, take a leisurely stroll back through the softly lit streets and along the lake. The evening atmosphere in Lugano is calm, scenic, and perfect for ending the day on a peaceful note.
